In an effort to support the ongoing education of our members, the Oregon HFMA chapter now offers a limited number of CHFP scholarships each year. Scholarship package includes HFMA-paid access to Module 1 (*Business of Healthcare*) and support from the Oregon HFMA Certification Committee. In addition, reimbursement will be given upon the scholar's successful completion of Module 2 (the *Operational Excellence* exam).

Eligibility Criteria:

1. Commitment to completing the certification process within 3-months
2. Availability of scholarships. We have a limited number of licenses and may need to postpone your scholarship until a later date.
